

The National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) has designated April as the Month of the Young Child and April 6th -12th, 2024 as the Week of the Young Child. Did you know that 90% of Brain Growth happens before Kindergarten? According to First Things First – From birth to age 5, a child's brain develops more than at any other time in life. And early brain development has a lasting impact on a child's ability to learn and succeed in school and life. The quality of a child's experiences in the first few years of life – positive or negative – helps shape how their brain Develops.

As you may have heard, we received a grant from the Santa Cruz County Superintendent's Office to create an Early Childhood Center on our campus. Plans are in place to remodel room 14/15 to provide a meeting room for parents, as well as an early childhood classroom. In addition, the grant will also pay for a playground structure, furniture, and equipment for the early childhood classroom.

At a minimum, this will provide a very nice space for childcare during parent programs. However, this space will also be designed to meet licensing requirements for a preschool program. 


Jaimee Cass – Para-Professional






