## 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade

In grades 2 and 3, students have been working on a *From Farm to Table* unit. They were introduced to the economics of goods and services in the farming and ranching industries, have been learning about the energy cycle and food chains, and the importance of 4-H, ranches, and farms. They took a field trip to the Vera Earl Ranch, Vera Earl Store, and

Frisky Lavender Farm. In science they learned about the life cycle of spiders and experimented with force and motion during a spider egg drop.

In addition to learning about these topics, 2nd and 3rd graders are growing their own garden. We had Mary, from Patagonia Plants, come in and teach us how to plant our seeds in biodegradable pots. 8th graders measured, designed, and built the gardens for us. 2nd graders made compost from their prior unit to add to the garden, as well! They will grow and harvest their lettuce, tomatoes, carrots, and radishes to eat!

They have also read *Charlotte's Web*. In writing, they formed their own opinions about the best farm animals and practiced finding facts/evidence in references to support their opinions. They will practice listening to each other's opinions and collaborate to see different points of view. Furthermore, they explored the book and discussed the characters, plot, and theme of the text, along with answering comprehension questions about each chapter.

They will also get to read with "Wilbur" in real life. They will be comparing and contrasting the book to the movie, too. It has been a fun and busy time in 2nd and 3rd grade!















## Fine Arts

The Art Classroom has been a haven for creative design during the month of September. The students have dedicated their efforts to making 3D sculptures, pinch pots, piggy banks, mugs, plaques, bowls, and personal masks out of clay. The kiln has been working regularly to fire greenware and bisqueware, resulting in some amazing works of art! The glazing step

takes patience and imagination, so the students have been experimenting with different types of glazes and styles. There has been some sgraffito (Italian for "scratched") work being done also on a few classes' items.

The process in creating a piece of pottery takes time. The students are given raw clay and are encouraged to design a specific project, using the class instructions, sculpting tools, and various items that create imprints on the clay surface. Working with clay is often therapeutic and the students are found to be working hard, while allowing their imaginations to come alive.

The clay pieces are then set on the shelf to dry slowly. It is considered greenware at this time. Once they have dried thoroughly (sometimes up to two weeks), the greenware is put in the kiln to bake up to 1300 degrees F. When the kiln cycle has finished and cooled, the ceramic piece (bisque ware) is given back to the student to glaze. When finished, the piece must dry on the shelf, thoroughly once again. Then, it is put back into the kiln for another firing. Ceramic glaze is made up of silica (glass former), alumina (the refractory), flux (the melting agent), and colorant. The type of glaze that is used at Elgin School is food safe, meaning if the ceramic piece is completely sealed with glaze and fired, it is safe for food. When a piece is glazed completely, it is also waterproof and much tougher than bisqueware. Each ceramic piece takes 2-4 weeks from start to finish.

The Elgin students love working with clay and have been improving their skills. They look forward to art class and being able to create their own ceramic masterpieces. They also love to share their creations with their families, often making the piece of art a keepsake for years to come.













### Ranch & Rodeo Day – By Mr. Neal Ryan

Elgin Elementary School recently hosted its annual Ranch & Rodeo Day celebration! Students were able to immerse themselves in the traditions of the Sonoita & Elgin communities through many activities; both fun and educational. Members of the community came out to support student's learning and appreciation for the ranching & rodeo traditions. Clint Etchart & Sonora Schmitt, Elgin School alumni and Vera Earl Ranch representatives, came to "show students the ropes" by bringing steer dummies for students to practice roping. Volunteers from the Empire Ranch Foundation really "buttered" students up by bringing in materials and teaching them how to make their own butter. Students then had a chance to sample their creation! Other activities were set up for students to test their knowledge and skills. Cowboy True & False tested how much they know about Arizona ranching history, and their skills were tested on the Equestrian Obstacle Course where students raced through hula hoops and over jump ropes! It was overall a very fun and enriching day for students!



# THE SCHOOL BOARD'S BUFFET OF CHALLENGES

After attending two conferences this summer, it was eye-opening to realize and see that the challenges facing Elgin School and the Sonoita District #25 are mirrored by many other school districts in the state and across the nation. We are dealing with a multitude of factors which can affect our small rural school. Teacher recruitment and retention, benefits for teachers and staff, lack of affordable housing for teachers and their families, and the impact of the ESA program (Empowerment Scholarship Accounts, also known as school vouchers) on public school funding, just to name a few.

Some schools in the state, especially in the Navajo Nation, have become employers AND landlords. They manage several large apartment complexes as there are no other housing options for their teachers. The Vail school district has built some "tiny homes" with reasonable rent for some of their staff. There are some housing options for our teachers in the Sierra Vista area which is a reasonable commute, but to find housing in Sonoita or Elgin would be preferable.

An increasing number of districts across the country have turned to hiring international teachers. Elgin School is in the process of hiring two experienced teachers from the Philippines.

It is a long, painstaking process for them and us, but our teachers will be here soon.

Administrators have reported international teachers have flourished in their schools, not just filling vacancies, but helping to improve overall academic standings.

As you can see, our buffet table is full with challenges, but with the support of our staff and our community we will continue to thrive.






Telephone Instructions:
